The Bach Academie Alden Biesen: Where History Comes to Life

At the heart of this musical institution lies the Bach Academie Alden Biesen, consisting of two extraordinary ensembles that breathe life into the rich tapestry of early music.

The Alden Biesen Baroque Choir: This ensemble comprises individuals for whom singing is not just an art form but an unyielding passion. A majority of its members boast professional musical training, which adds depth and finesse to their performances.

The Alden Biesen Baroque Ensemble & Orchestra: Drawn from a roster of professional musicians, this orchestra is a collective of specialists who excel in the art of performing music on authentic, historical instruments. Their commitment to historical accuracy is unwavering.

Historical Informed & Inspired Performances

The approach adopted by the Bach Academie Alden Biesen is twofold – Historically Informed & Inspired Performances, also known as 2x H.I.P. This approach brings the essence and spirit of historical eras to life, immersing audiences in an authentic musical experience.

A Repertoire Spanning Centuries

The breadth of their repertoire is remarkable, from 1600 - the ending Renaissance to the turning Baroque - to 1800, the French Revolution, spanning from Monteverdi to Mendelssohn, with a keen focus on:

- Cantatas, Oratorios, and Passionen by J.S. Bach
- Baroque opera from 1600 to approximately 1800
- Instrumental music and concerti in a variety of ensemble sizes, from duos to full baroque orchestras
- A myriad of works for soloists, choir, and orchestra, including compositions by Monteverdi, Buxtehude, Händel, Mozart, Mendelssohn, and more

The Bach Academie Alden Biesen presents a wide range of captivating programme lines:


- Organum Imperiale: An international organ concert series that resonates with the essence of time.
- **Passion concerts**: Transporting audiences through the ages via oratorios and passions from the 17th and 18th centuries.

Artistic director - Luc Ponet

Luc Ponet is the titular organist of the Basilica in Tongeren, organist-in-residence at the Land Commandery Alden Biesen, professor of organ at Leuven University College of Arts – Lemmens campus, and city organist of Leuven. He is also the curator of the Leuven Organ City Festival. Over the years, he has garnered worldwide recognition as a concert organist. As a researcher, he is affiliated with the University of Leuven, where he is pursuing a doctorate (PhD) focused on the Tongeren Organ Manuscript (1626) and organ practice in the Prince-Bishopric of Liège in the first half of the 17th century.

Additionally, he is the driving force and artistic director/conductor of the Bach Academie Alden Biesen (choir and orchestra, using period instruments) and the artistic director of the Intra Muros Festival. His repertoire preferences include Johann Sebastian Bach (organ works, cantatas, and oratorios), French Baroque music (from the 16th century to the French Revolution), and, of course, the music from the former Prince-Bishopric of Liège (organ and orchestral works). His CD recordings, including those for Naxos, R. Gailly, Pavane, and Et'cetera, are in line with his musical interests and have received praise from critics worldwide.
